Good days of Dulan

It may be hard to imagine now but sugar was a major agricultural commodity in Taiwan just before and for years following World War II. By the late 1930s, sugar plantations covered nearly one-fifth of Taiwan's farmland and sugar refineries had been opened across most of the island. Sugar production hit a peak in 1950 and began to decline in the 1970s due to competition from other countries. As the refineries closed one by one, some were torn down but about a dozen were left to the elements and neglect. As Taiwan's economy began to improve and people began to have time and resources to spend on artistic and cultural activities, art and cultural spaces came into demand. Unused buildings, once considered an eyesore, were transformed into artist workshops, studios and exhibition space. This is what happened to the Xindong Brown Sugar Refinery, long a landmark of Dulan Village in Donghe Township of Taitung County. Although its original buildings and smokestack were left mostly intact, art production and exhibition spaces, as well as restaurants, shops and performance stage were developed more than a dozen years ago. It is now known as the Xindong Sugar Refinery Cultural Park or more commonly as the Dulan Sugar Refinery Artist Village... Read more
