The Alliance Cultural Foundation: IBM Taiwan achieves 2018 IBM Volunteer Excellence Award

2017 to 2018, in collaboration with ACF, the IBM Taiwan volunteer team developed a mentoring program for ACF youth volunteers who are in college or are new in their post-college job. Out of 250 applications, IBM awarded only 15 – ten teams and five individuals worldwide. Each winner and winning team received a grant of \$10,000 which the IBM Taiwan team donated to ACF to further support its volunteer program nurturing young talents in its field.

Jean-Christophe Knoertzer, Vice-President of IBM Corporate Social Responsibility, paid a visit to Taiwan, and shared a dialogue with ACF Chair Stanley Yen on vocational education and how technology platforms as IBM can help individuals in skills-based learning.

Taiwan Connection:

2019 Taiwan Connection Music Festival

2019 marks the third year ACF has worked with Taiwan Connection (TC) to help promote its annual music festival. TC Co-founder and Director Nai-yuan Hu invites a total of 53 musicians from Taiwan and overseas to partake in this year's TC Music Festival. Even more valiant than years prior, the conductorless orchestra selects Johannes Brahms' *Symphony No. 2 in D Major, Op. 73*, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's *Divertimento in D major, K. 136/125a*, and Felix Mendelssohn's *Violin Concerto in E Minor, Op. 64*.

Four notable musicians joining the performance include Andrew Bain, principal horn player of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Ole Akahoshi, cellist and Professor of the Yale School of Music, Flutist Göran Marcusson of the GotesborgsMusiken Chamber Ensemble, and Yoda Akinobu, principal bassoonist of the Tokyo Geidai Symphony Orchestra. Hu notes that this year's pieces will be more lighthearted and playful, breaking the serious impression of classical music.
