The graduation project is the highlight for grade 12 students at Ci-Xin Waldorf School; students spend the year researching, exploring and connecting with the world. Each graduate is to present on stage for twenty minutes with topics ranging from literature, painting, ceramic arts, architecture, traditional dance, food culture, drum making, racing, philosophy, music, opera, film, volunteering, environmental, and tai chi, to name a few. Their aim is to not only learn from the topic, but to find meaning and to connect it to their current lives. Presentations ranged from a traditional Israeli dance performance, a self-composed piece of music expressing experiences from a student's final years of high school, to an 80,000 word novel written by a student who usually had few words to say... Duli Community

An Amis village that emphasizes the nostalgic...

The picturesque coastal highway (Provincial Highway 11) that stretches between Hualien and Taitung is dotted with communities of the indigenous Amis tribe. One such community, situated in Chenggong Town of Taitung County, is referred to as Duli in Chinese. This is a transliteration of the Amis name of this community, Torik, which commemorates one of its founders. This community has a long history. The first mention of it in historical records is in a survey of eastern Taiwan in 1879. However, it was originally located elsewhere, higher up in the foothills in an area of plateau where the East Coast National Scenic Area Administration's visitor center now sits... Read more
